What a wonderful and joyful last week we have had!



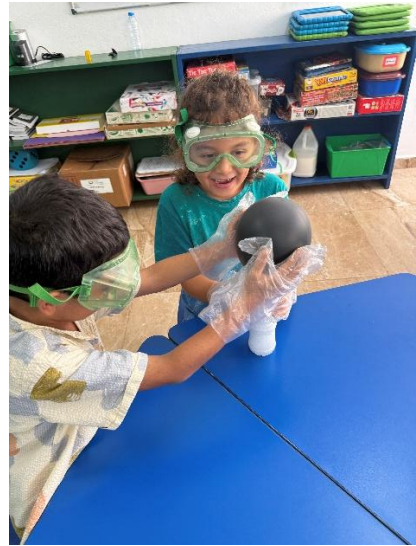
Grade 1-2

Grade 5-8 (English and Social Studies)

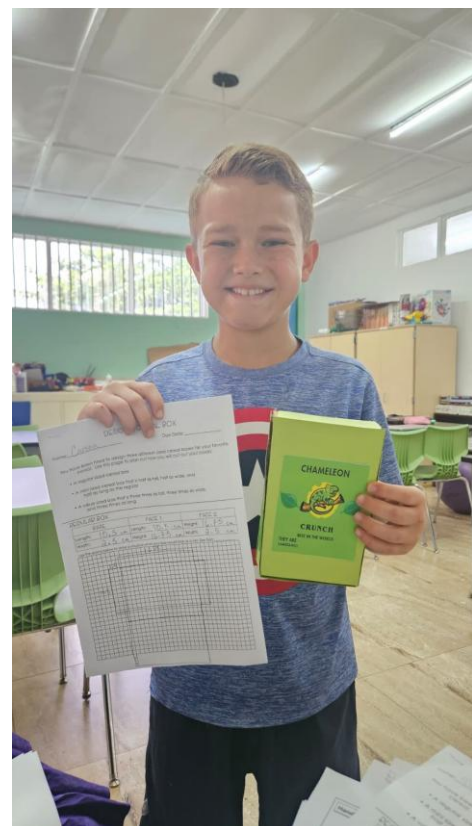

Grade 5-8 (Math and Science)

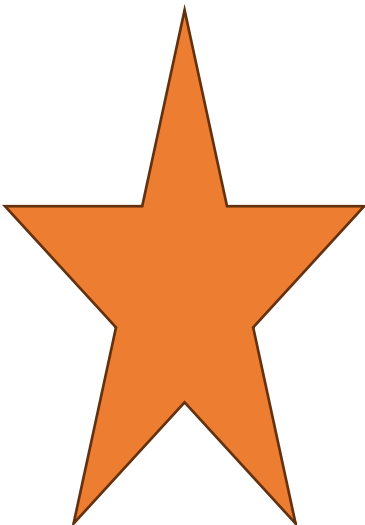

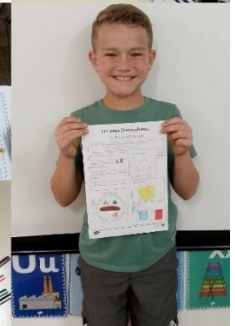
We also touched base with our language passport to help us know where we are in our language learning journey and made our language tree to help us determine how many languages we speak.

For added fun and review, we used **Kahoot**, where friendly competitions helped reinforce vocabulary and grammar in an energetic and enjoyable way.
